## 1 SELF-INJURIOUS BEHAVIOR

*(intermediate/advanced)*

Self-injuring behaviors are destructive coping methods used by adolescents at an increasingly alarming rate in our society. Some adolescents have even resorted to what they call "cutting clubs."

- list and describe proven interventions to teach healthy alternatives to self-harm, and
- describe how to care for those who have self-harmed
